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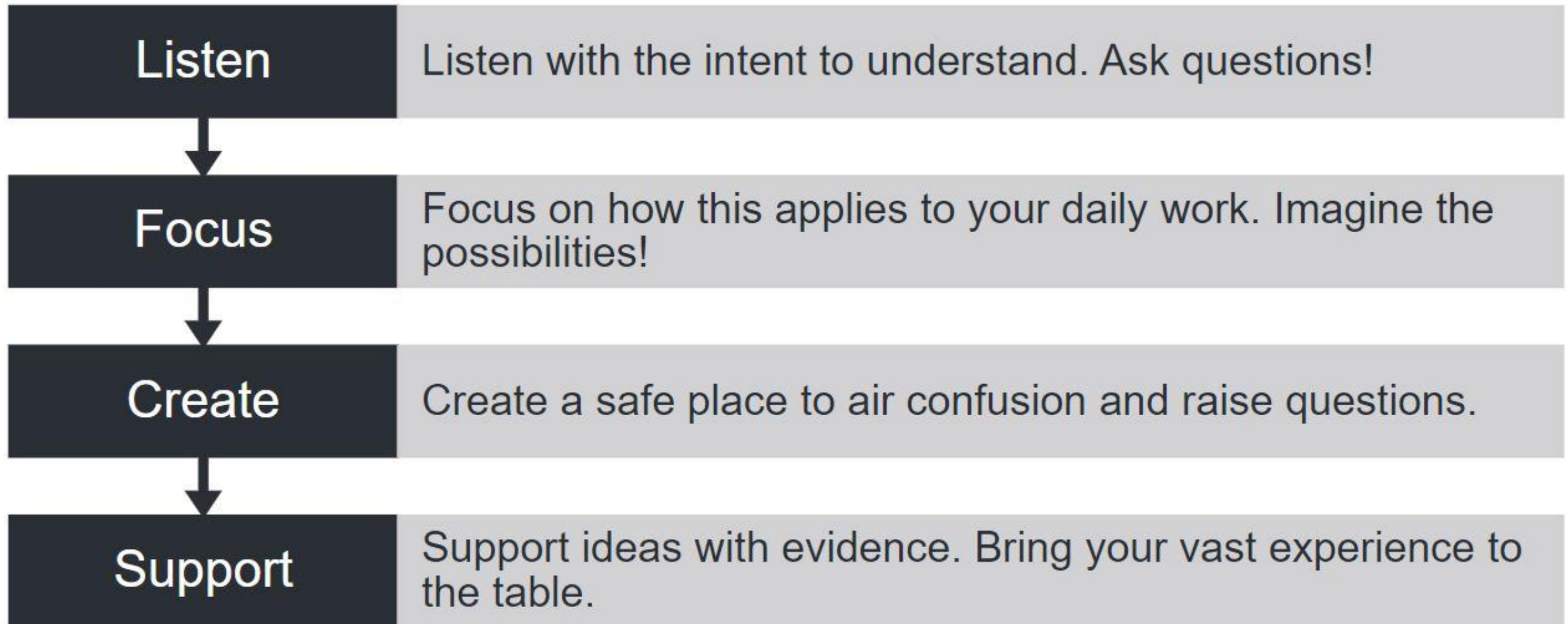

Bull's Head - Soda Gingembre- \$2.50

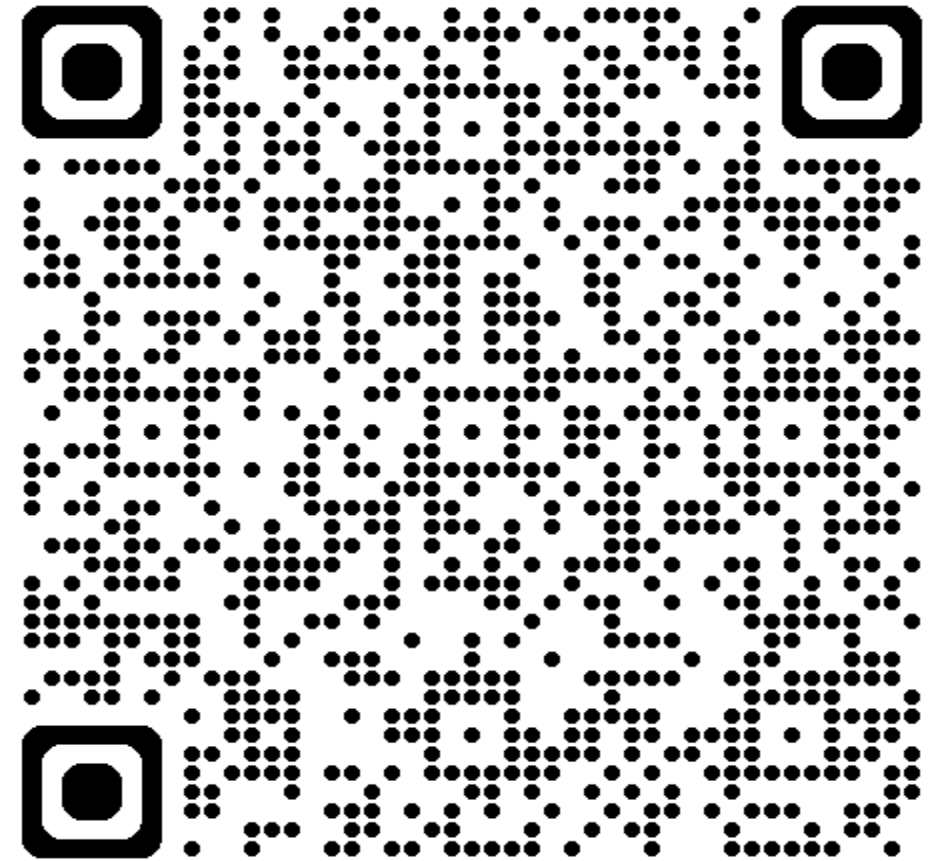

 - B. Font is legible



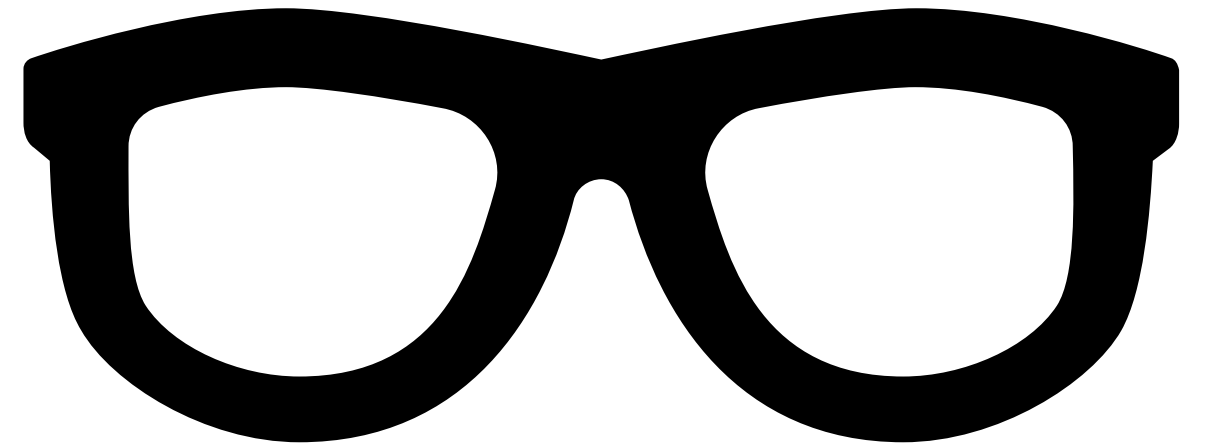

HOW MIGHT YOU *EXTEND* THIS IDEA?

IDEAS FOR **EXTENSION**

- **Health –**

- Consider the caloric content, allergens, and dietary restrictions of menu items

- **Social Studies –**

- Economics: "Restaurant Marketplace"
- Geography: Include physical or human geographical characteristics
- History: Menu options may include references to history and culture

- **Financial Literacy –**

- Discuss thought process in decision-making to "purchase" specific items
- Consider investment options among the restaurants
- Explore how paying by credit cards can increase the cost of the purchase

IDEAS FOR **EXTENSION**

- **Arts –**

- Media Arts: Create a website about the restaurant/menu
- Theatre: Create a short commercial for the restaurant/menu
- Music: Curate a playlist of appropriate music for the restaurant

- **World Languages and Intercultural Competence –**

- Be open and curious about other cultures, such as trying new foods
- Identify the importance of traditions in my own and in other cultures
- Think about why perspectives might differ across cultures
- How do I know how to interact with people from other cultures?
